 Answer: The king was fed up with the talks going around about Hilsa-fish. It was the season of hilsa-fish and everyone was talking about the fish.
- 2) What did the king ask Gopal to do to prove that he was clever? Answer: The king asked Gopal to bring Hilsa fish to the palace without anyone asking a word about the fish.
- 3) What three things did Gopal do before he went to buy his hilsa-fish?Answer: The three things that Gopal did before he went to buy his hilsa-fish was
 - He half-shaved his beard.
 - He smeared himself with ash.
 - And put on disgraceful rags.
- 4) How did Gopal get inside the palace to see the king after he had bought the fish?
